RE: Korea Restriction of Hazardous Substances (RoHS)

Dear Customer,

Rockwell Automation is committed to demonstrating the highest standard of global environmental management. We embrace this as a core value and an integral part of all operations and seek continual improvement of our environmental management system and performance. Our dedication is demonstrated by our efforts as they apply to the numerous directives on the Restriction of Hazardous Substances (RoHS), including the Korean RoHS directive.

Effective January 1, 2008, Korea implemented a regulation requiring manufacturers and importers of some electrical and electronic products to comply with maximum concentration values of six hazardous substances as well as meet recycling requirements.

The six hazardous substances are lead, mercury, cadmium, hexavalent chromium, PBB and PBD—the same substances and maximum concentration values as those regulated in the European RoHS Directive.

Targeted products are televisions, refrigerators, washing machines, air conditioners, personal computers, mobile phones, printers, copiers and facsimile machines. Industrial products are not covered.

Based on our understanding of the Korean RoHS/WEEE Directive, Rockwell Automation products are not subject to the Korean RoHS/WEEE law at this time. If the Korean regulations are expanded in the future to include industrial products, Rockwell Automation will make the necessary changes to its in-scope products.
